


En écho au projet *Billboards* présenté dans l'espace public, les pages qui suivent proposent un autre travail réalisé par Meriç Algün Ringborg. Partant une nouvelle fois d'un récit personnel, elle a cherché l'origine de deux tableaux hérités de son grand-père. Grâce à des échanges d'e-mails, elle remonte peu à peu à la source de ces images et réalise une surprenante découverte. En 2013, ce texte est paru dans la publication en ligne *This Long Century*. Les échanges d'e-mails sont conservés dans leur langue originale, l'anglais.



Les cieux expriment la gloire de Dieu et le firmament annonce l'œuvre de ses mains. SL.19,1

« Mon grand-père travaillait à bord de cargos et a donc parcouru le monde, du nord de la Russie au cap de Bonne Espérance en Afrique, du Brésil au Japon en passant par le Canada. Il a commencé à travailler à bord de navires dès la fin de son service militaire obligatoire, qu'il a effectué à Zonguldak, une ville située dans la région de la mer Noire en Turquie. Il n'avait que 20 ans à l'époque et il a travaillé jusqu'à ce qu'il soit atteint d'un cancer à l'âge de 65 ans. Il avait cinq filles et a eu la chance de connaître trois de ses cinq petits-enfants. Mon grand-père était loin quasiment six mois par an. Sa présence (et les souvenirs que nous gardions de lui) était donc très fragmentée. À chacun de ses retours, il ramenait des cadeaux et des souvenirs pour chaque membre de la famille.

Un jour, en rentrant du Brésil, il nous a ramené deux reproductions de paysage, montées dans des cadres en bois, sur lesquelles étaient inscrites deux phrases en portugais. Les tableaux furent accrochés dans la cuisine, là où nous passions le plus clair de notre temps. Nous pensions tous que ces photos avaient été prises au Brésil, mais personne dans la famille ne parlait une autre langue et nous ne savions donc pas ce que signifiaient ces phrases. Malgré cela, toute la famille avait fini par mémoriser l'une des deux phrases, peut-être pour se sentir plus proche de mon grand-père, et la répétait à haute voix à chaque repas, avec un mélange de dérision et d'émotion véritable, comme une sorte de prière.

Le turc est une langue phonétique et les mots se prononcent donc tels qu'ils sont écrits. Nous lisons donc l'inscription portugaise comme suit :

"Osceus manifasitam aglorya dedeus eofirmamante anunçia obradaasusasmaos."

La cuisine où avait lieu ce rituel se trouvait dans la maison qu'il avait lui-même construite. Les membres de la famille qui y résidaient sont partis les uns après les autres, et la maison a depuis longtemps disparu. Ainsi, les tableaux ont subi plusieurs déménagements, avant de finir sous un lit, d'où je les ai extirpés l'hiver passé. Ce que je remarquai tout d'abord, c'était la mention "SL. 19,1" écrite en petits caractères sous l'une des phrases. Je compris aussitôt qu'il s'agissait de versets de la Bible. Après l'avoir entendue si souvent prononcée par mes tantes, j'avais fini par assimiler la phrase et je me suis sentie un peu bête en réalisant qu'elle provenait de la Bible... Ma famille n'est pas particulièrement religieuse et si nous devions nous proclamer d'une quelconque religion, ce ne serait certainement pas du christianisme.

La prochaine étape dans la déconstruction de ce souvenir serait de savoir où se situent les paysages représentés dans ces photos. J'ai tenté de faire quelques recherches sur Google, mais je n'ai pas pu les identifier. On m'a suggéré, sans conviction, qu'il s'agissait peut-être d'un endroit à Rio de Janeiro. dear merica,

i think the first picture shows lagoa rodrigo de freitas, a famous lagoon in rio de janeiro. i think the second picture is not brazil, we don't have that sort of architecture and the mountain looks too alpine. we definitely don't have snow here! i would say it's switzerland.

the first text reads: The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. it's psalm 19. the second text reads: God shall be exalted in heavens; his glory, all around Earth. it's also religious, but there's no indication of the source.

i find it curious that your family in turkey learned a sentence in portuguese. i would never imagine. and the pronunciation must be quite right, because the writing is almost perfect. you can listen to the sentence here, between 15s and 22s. (funny narration though.)

brazil has the biggest number of catholics in the world. we have churches everywhere and the pope often visits us. (we were really sad that a brazilian lost the papacy for an argentinian a few years ago. argentina and brazil are rivals in football.)

but we are also very much influenced by african religions, like umbanda and candomblé. my mother always leaves coffee close to a window, an offering for the spirits. and, once year, she sets a big tray of candy in our backyard, also for a spirit.

i'm not religious and i don't believe in god, but i'm interested in religion sociologically, as someone would be interested in an experiment. seeing it from a distance, watching it behind a piece of glass. (besides, i rather never mess with spirits. you never know, right?)

i found one section of your text particularly interesting: "Nobody in the family is particularly religious. And if there is a religion vaguely present, it certainly isn't Christianity." it resonates with me because i cannot imagine a country where christians are not a majority.

what is the major religion in turkey? and how does it affect the behaviour of people and your life? i know how secular your country is, but i met a person from istanbul once and she told me about your president and the menace he represents to this secularity.

also, what is the major religion in sweden? i met quite a few people from scandinavia and never spoke about religion with them. actually, i never speak about religion with anyone, not even close friends. we say here in brazil it's not polite. i hope we can break this rule for once.
